Upon successful completion of this course you will:

- 1. Describe and explain the history of chemical dependency and its impact on society. *Evaluation Methods: quizzes, exams, blog entries.*
- 2. Discuss theories that explain chemical addiction. *Evaluation Methods: quizzes, exams, blog entries.*
- 3. Understand the characteristics and dynamics of the family of chemically dependent individuals and treatment issues related to the recovery process of the various family members. *Evaluation Methods: quizzes, exams, blog entries.*
- 4. Apply screening tools and diagnostic methods for assessing the chemically dependent client. *Evaluation Methods: quizzes, exams, blog entries.*
- 5. Identify support systems and recovery resources for clients. *Evaluation Methods: quizzes, exams, blog entries*
- 6. Critically evaluate the rapeutic techniques used in both individual and group settings for chemical addiction. *Evaluation Methods: quizzes, exams, blog entries, final paper.*

Course Requirements:

1. Chapter Quizzes

Students will complete weekly quizzes addressing the textbook chapter(s) covered in each weekly learning module. These quizzes will assess the students' knowledge of the course material.

2. Weekly Blog Assignments

Students will complete weekly blog assignments addressing the information presented in the textbook chapter(s) covered in each weekly learning module. Students are also required to comment on a minimum of three (3) other students' blog posts so as to facilitate communication between students and promote positive learning with peer observation and feedback.

3. Mid-Term Exam

Students will complete an exam at the mid-point of the course covering information offered to that point. This exam is designed to assess the students' knowledge of the course material covered to date.

4. Final Paper

Students will complete a five-page paper as their final assignment in the course. This paper will help assess students' ability to utilize critical thinking as well as their ability to do a literature review and utilize the information to defend a field of thought.

- 2. Weekly Blog Assignments (8@10 points each)
- 3. Midterm Exam (50 points)
- 4. Final Paper (100 points)

Week One Learning Module

- Blog Assignment Discuss the history of chemical addiction and at least one (1) ethical or legal issue that could impact practice and why. Respond to a minimum of three (3) other students' posts. 20 points

Chapter 3 – The Major Substances of Abuse and the Body Chapter 4 – Etiology of Substance Abuse: Why People Use

- Quiz covering both chapters 20 points
- Blog Assignment Discuss the effects of various substances upon the body and brain. Pick one (1) theory that you think best explains chemical addiction and discuss the specifics of that theory and how it supports you view of addiction. Respond to a minimum of three (3) other students' posts. – 20 points

Chapter 5 – Assessment and Diagnosis Chapter 6 – Treatment Setting and Treatment Planning

- Quiz covering both chapters 20 points
- Blog Assignment Pick one of the screening tools discussed in the chapter and use it on someone you know who uses alcohol or other drugs (do not include any names or identifying information in your post). Discuss the results as well as what the interview experience was like for you as well as the person you interviewed, e.g. how comfortable were you with the process; did you encounter or note any defensiveness; did you note any tendency in yourself to "rescue" the other person from uncomfortable questions? Also, pick one the treatment setting (as discussed in Chapter 6) that you feel would be most effective in dealing with addiction issues and discuss why. Respond to a minimum of three (3) other students' posts. 20 points

Chapter 8 – Group Treatment in the Continuum of Care

- Quiz covering both chapters 20 points
- Blog Assignment Discuss individual and group treatment issues. Why is the therapeutic relationship between the client and therapist important in treatment? What are the benefits of group therapy and why is it the most common form of treatment for chemical addiction? Respond to a minimum of three (3) other students' posts. 20 points
- Mid-Term Quiz 40 points

Chapter 10 - Retaining Sobriety: Relapse Prevention Strategies

- Quiz covering both chapters 20 points
- Blog Assignment Discuss the benefits of family therapy in treating chemical addiction. Also, discuss factors affecting both relapse and recovery including the importance of relearning how to experience pleasure. Respond to a minimum of three (3) other students' posts. – 20 points

Week Six Learning Module

Chapter 11 – Working with Selected Populations: Treatment Issues and Characteristics Chapter 12 – Working with Diverse Cultures: Exploring Sociocultural Influences and Realities in ATOD Treatment and Prevention

- Quiz covering both chapters 20 points
- Blog Assignment Discuss the unique issues elated to providing treatment services to various populations and cultures. What are some barriers that some populations may experience seeking treatment? What cultural values are important for a therapist to know? Respond to a minimum of three (3) other students' posts. 20 points

Chapter 13 – Prevention

Quiz - 10 points

 Blog Assignment – Discuss prevention efforts in addressing chemical dependency as well as the steps in effective prevention program planning. Respond to a minimum of three (3) other students' posts. – **10 points**

Week Eight Learning Module

Final Paper – 100 points

Pick a theory from the textbook that you believe offers the best explanation for chemical addiction as well as a treatment approach that you feel is best suited to address the problem. Discuss why you believe they are the most appropriate using a review of the literature utilizing peer reviewed articles to defend your choices.
